 - Target Audience: Small Businesses -- who do not qualify for conventional financing and meet eligibility requirements
 - Loan Products:
 - <u>7(a) Loan</u>: to buy real estate, equipment or inventory. Also for working capital, to refinance business debt or purchase a small business. Max loan of \$5 million.
 - <u>SBAExpress Loan</u>: 7(a) loans delivered by lenders on behalf of SBA with max loan of \$350,000.
 - Community Advantage Program: financing for women, veterans, lowincome borrowers, and minority entrepreneurs just starting up or in business for a few years. Receive free business counseling as you work with a community-based financial institution. Max \$250,000. Program pilot expires March 31, 2020.
 - Microloan Program: Borrow \$500 to \$50,000 and access free business counseling for working capital or funds for supplies, equipment, furniture and fixtures.
 - <u>504 Certified Development Company Loan Program</u>: to purchase/renovate real estate or buy heavy equipment
- State of Maryland
 - <u>Microenterprise Loan Program</u>: \$500-\$50,000 for remodeling work and asset purchase (not property acquisition)

- Target Audience: Small Businesses (under \$500,000 in annual revenue and not more than 5 employees at time of application)
- <u>Neighborhood BusinessWorks Loan Program</u>: Up to \$5 million for rehab, asset acquisition
 - Target Audience: Small Businesses

- Baltimore Development Corporation
 - Micro Loan Program: Low-interest \$5,000-\$30,000 loans to existing and start-up small businesses for working capital, furniture, fixtures, machinery, and equipment.

Tax Credits/Incentives

- Federal:
 - <u>HUBZone program</u>: federal government's goal to award at least 3% of all federal contracting dollars to HUBZone-certified small businesses each year. All of SWP qualifies, but <u>see if you qualify for other requirements</u>.
- State:
 - Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE) financing: C-PACE is a financing mechanism designed to promote energy and water efficiency improvements, and installation of renewable energy systems, for commercial, industrial, agricultural, nonProfit and multifamily buildings with 5 or more dwelling units. <u>MAPA website</u>. If you're interested in this program, SWP can arrange a conversation with their program manager.
 - <u>One Maryland</u>: tax credits for jobs created (nonprofits are eligible)
 - <u>Job Creation Tax Credit Program</u>: tax credits for jobs created in "revitalization" areas (Entire Southwest Partnership area is eligible)
 - Tech company tax credits -- <u>See attached</u>
 - Maryland Historic Trust (MHT) Programs (Note: Your property must fall within a historic district--see websites for more details)
 - <u>Small Commercial Tax Credit</u>: For projects up to \$500,000 and not used for more than 75% residential rental purposes
 - <u>Competitive Commercial Tax Credit</u>: For income-producing properties with projects above \$25,000. Eligible for 20% credit up to \$3 million.
 - Capital Projects: Up to \$100,000 for acquisition, restoration, and rehabilitation of historic properties in Maryland. Eligible properties are limited to those which are listed in or eligible for the Maryland Register, either individually or as a contributing structure within a district.
- City:
 - Baltimore Development Corporation
 - Façade improvement grant (FIG) programs

- <u>Traditional FIG</u>:matching grants up to \$25,000 (depending on location and property use) to improve business/industrial facade <u>see fact sheet for full listing</u>
- <u>Violence Reduction Initiative (VRI) FIG</u>: Provides \$10,000 grant with no matching requirement

MARKET RESEARCH

- <u>Is a contractor licensed</u> with State of Maryland? See if an individual is licensed before they do business for you.

- Online Map w/ Neighborhood Profiles (NEW): This map includes basically all of the Planning Departments GIS layers. If you are zoomed out far enough you can click on the map for a link to neighborhood profiles (Census data), and when zoomed in far enough you can click for property information like in <u>codeMap</u>.
- Housing Market Typology: Helps identify real estate market types across the City
- <u>CityView</u>: Where you can always check economic incentives for any property in the city
- <u>Cityview/BETA (NEW)</u>: Same data as CityView, but has new features like being able to draw your own boundaries and download data just from those geographic areas.
- <u>CodeMap</u>: Where you can get City Housing Department data on any property
- <u>Permit Search</u>: find out if a property has permits pulled on it for construction or Use & Occupancy.
- <u>Property Tax Search</u>: Find out if a property owner is delinquent on taxes. It might be eligible for tax sale.
- <u>Real Property Data Search</u>: State Department of Taxation information
- How to do a Deed Search
- <u>SWP Development Map</u>: See the major development areas and projects in Southwest Partnership footprint.
- <u>Central Maryland Development Tracker</u> (PAID Service): tracks development projects in the pre-planning stages as a service to developers.
